






### Transportation

- Bus transportation is offered free of charge to K-6 students living more than 2 miles from their school. The fee for all others is \$400. (\$1,150 family cap)
- Buses operate for 7:55am start and 11:30am/2:25pm/1:15pm (W) dismissal.
- Bus registration is open from March 1-31.
   Bus routes will be posted in mid summer.


#### Buffer Zones Info

- <u>Definition</u>: A buffer zone is defined as an area for which individual addresses may be assigned to one of two elementary schools.
- Goal: Buffer zones are used to reduce the need to add additional classrooms while seeking to even out class size across the district.



#### Buffer Zones Info

 Buffer zone school assignments are made by the Superintendent based on grade level enrollment capacity, class size, and transportation.




# Nuts and Bolts for Indicating Kdg Preference

## Nuts and Bolts - Continued

- Families in a buffer zone can indicate school preference - but not guaranteed
- Final decisions on school placement will be made by the end of May. At that time, you will receive instructions to complete your child's registration and how to upload medical forms through eSchoolPLUS portal.






## What to Expect as the School Year Begins

## The Metropolitan Council for Educational Opportunity (METCO)

#### Exactly what is METCO?

- METCO stands for the METropolitan COuncil for Educational Opportunity
- State funded voluntary educational desegregation program designed to eliminate racial imbalance through the busing of children from Boston, MA and Springfield, MA to suburban public schools in the 33 communities where the program operates.

#### What is the purpose of METCO?

- The purpose is to provide the opportunity for an integrated public school education for children of color in suburban schools.
- Offer an integrated learning experience for suburban children; and to facilitate understanding and cooperation between urban and suburban students, parents/ caregivers.

#### Home Language Surveys


All new families are asked to complete the HLS to determine a students language needs (even if English is primary language)

#### WIDA Screener

To determine whether your child is eligible for the English Learner Program (Completed in the Fall)

English Learner Education (ELE) Program available for students who live in homes in which a language other than English is spoken. English Language teachers collaborate with classroom teachers to develop and teach a modified instructional plan
