THE KINDERGARTEN PROGRAM

(must be five years old by August 31)
THREE, FOUR, OR FIVE DAYS

The Kindergarten program is tailored to the changing needs of children about to begin school and is led by a knowledgeable and caring staff. Along with indoor and outdoor fun with their group, the children enjoy games, dance, science, yoga and movement, story time, music, and creative play.

Each session, kindergartners take a field trip to an area destination.

Afternoon options from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.

EXTENDED DAY

For all age groups, Pegasus offers extended hours from 8:00 a.m. until 9:00 a.m. and from 3:00 p.m. until 5:30 p.m. It is a time for indoor and outdoor exploratory play and combines free play and special activities. Outdoor sports, playground time, water play, board games, music, art, and free play choices are offered.

Wonderful Wednesdays - Grades 1 - 6

Children board the Pegasus bus on Wednesdays for a field trip to an area destination. On Wonderful Wednesdays, dismissal is at 3:00 pm. Destinations will be to museums, parks, farms, a water park, zoo, and more. Each summer's schedule is different and destinations may vary by age group.

Fantastic Fridays for Preschool - Grade 6

Each three-week session will include a special event day with water slides. This summer's weekly themes are: Disney, Party in the USA, Color Me Happy, Let's Go to the Beach, It's a Jungle Out There, and Wild West. The final Friday of each session includes performances by young dancers and actors as well as a viewing of the session's TV show.

KINDERGARTEN THROUGH GRADE SIX Recreational Swim at Wayland Community Pool
